Youth - The Hope Youth Center in Kyrgyzstan offers daily programs and summer activities.

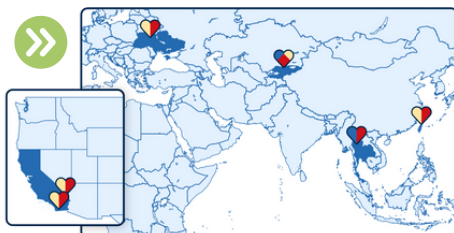

In Taiwan, over 320,000 Indonesian migrants work as caregivers, factory workers, and fishermen far from their home country. Led by God, LSI serves among them by offering care, support, and hope. Together with local churches, we provide language programs, cultural care activities, and fellowship for those who have limited access to support while adapting to a new environment and facing mistreatment.

The Story of Sally

Sally came to Taiwan with a simple hope to work hard so her family in Indonesia could live better. She picked fruit from morning until night at a local farm. When a severe toothache struck, she kept working despite the pain, afraid of losing her job. By the time she reached the hospital, urgent treatment was needed, yet her employer had not paid her wages when she needed the money most. Alone in the hospital, far from home, Sally could only cry.

Many Indonesian migrant workers face illness, mistreatment, and unpaid wages in silence. Their stories remind us of the need for understanding and support. LSI Hope Center in Taiwan walks alongside them through these struggles.

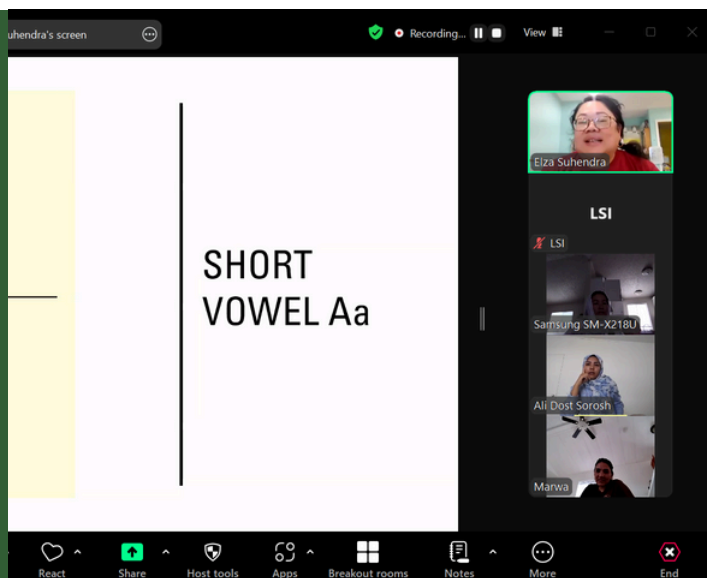

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HELP AFGHAN ADULTS LEARN ENGLISH!

LSI is **urgently** seeking volunteer English tutors for our online program supporting newly arrived Afghan adults in the Mojave community.

TUTORS NEEDED

- 🔴 Who We Need:
 - Anyone with fluent English (No prior teaching experience required)
- 🔴 What to do:
 - Teach basic English to adults
 - Provide one-on-one lessons via Zoom
 - Teach for half an hour per lesson, once a week
 - Follow the provided English curriculum

Tutors Needed

LSI is urgently recruiting volunteer English tutors for the second year of our online program, starting in April. All materials are prepared, and each lesson is just 30 minutes, once a week, with a one-month break every two months. This is a great opportunity to build meaningful relationships with Mojave Afghans as we help them navigate daily challenges. No teaching experience is needed, and sessions are one-on-one and easy to follow (contact no. 626-551-8473).
